- Flashcards or game cards like Old Maid or Go Fish
- · Activity book or coloring book
- Playdough can
- 3" bouncy ball
- Ready-to-read paperback books
- Small stuffed animal (Beanie Baby size)

For Teen Age Youth:

- Fancy/fun writing pen or highlighter
- Jewelry-making bead kit
- Playing cards
- Hacky-Sac ball
- Activity books such as Sudoku, Crossword, etc.
- Small stuffed animal (Beanie Baby size)

For Street Youth:

- Warm gloves
- Wallet
